GNS Science, Te Pū Ao

The name *Te Pū Ao* was gifted to GNS Science by kaumatua, Wiremu Tāwhai, of Te Whānau-ā-Apanui. The name reflects the very deepest origins of our world. It was gifted in specific recognition of the core work GNS undertakes to better understand our world, its origins, and its ever-changing essence.

Their vision is to seek to create a cleaner, safer, more prosperous future for Aotearoa New Zealand.

Their purpose is to undertake research that:

- Increases Aotearoa New Zealand's resilience to natural hazards;
- Enhances our understanding of geological and Earth-system processes;
- Drives innovation and sustainable economic growth in our energy sector; and
- Develops new materials, products and approaches to assist other agencies with sustainable management of risk, environment and natural Earth and groundwater resources.

GNS Science, Te Pū Ao Scholarship Information / Criteria

This scholarship includes Tuition fees and course related costs including travel to the value of \$12,500 per student per year. Administration and payment of the scholarship will be managed and disbursed at the discretion of WITT Te Pūkenga.

To be eligible for an GNS Science Engineering scholarship you must meet all of the following criteria:

- Must be a current or prospective fulltime New Zealand Diploma in Engineering or Bachelor of Engineering Technology Civil/Mechanical student; prospective students must meet the programme entry criteria
- Must be able to participate in summer internships/mentorships within GNS or suggested stakeholders within Taranaki
- Must be able to conduct research with GNS related to Energy projects and aligned with the aims of Aotearoa
- To retain their scholarship, recipients are required to pass all of their subjects each trimester
- Once a scholarship has been awarded any changes to the recipient's enrolment, including changes to
 programmes, holds, delays or any other alterations may result in forfeiture of the scholarship. Continuation of
 the scholarship, or part thereof, is solely at the discretion of the NZIHT Scholarship committee.
- Be a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident at the time of application
- Be available to attend an interview with WITT /GNS staff
- Commit to a minimum attendance requirement that may apply
