



## New Zealand Certificate in Hairdressing (Salon Support) (NZ2411) Level 3

### You will learn how to:

- apply knowledge of salon culture, hierarchy and specific industry terminology to communicate appropriately with clients, peers and supervisors within the salon.
- follow instructions and ensure observation of technical skills is respectful of the client experience.
- undertake limited reception duties, including appointment making, home hair care sales and maintenance of retail product displays.
- apply knowledge of the key role a salon assistant plays to provide limited support services that contribute to the client journey through the salon.
- perform a limited scope consultation, including hair and scalp analysis.
- perform elementary styling tasks, including blow drying, moulding, setting and hair ups.
- safely hold scissors, follow a pre-cut guide, comb and project the hair and maintain even tension on a mannequin.
- mix, apply and remove a limited range of colour treatments as directed.
- understand the process and basic principles when neutralising chemical reformation services.
- meet the personal health and presentation requirements of the salon environment, and self-style in ways that promote current trends in fashion.
- follow workplace health, safety, hygiene and environmental policies.
- identify and report potential hazards to minimise the impact of workplace hazards in the salon environment.

### PROGRAMME INFORMATION

#### HSS2.100

This course is for students wishing to develop skills and knowledge at an entry level in hairdressing. Skills and knowledge include: elementary techniques for highlights and/or lowlights, applying and removing oxidative colour, fundamentals of colour, selecting and applying non-oxidative hair colour, and the neutralising process and its effect. Includes Unit Standards: 19793, 25789, 28835 and 25791.

#### HSS2.101

The course is for students wishing to develop skills and knowledge at an entry level in hairdressing. Skills and knowledge include: knowledge of trichology and common conditions of the hair and scalp. Includes Unit Standards: 2873 and 28848.

#### HSS3.100

Skills and knowledge include: conversation and interaction with clients and salon operators, workplace interactions and requirements, professional behaviour, legal requirements, appointment systems, product displays and product recommendations. Includes Unit Standards: 21938, 21940, 28844, 25435, 25436 and 25794.

#### HSS3.101

This course is for students wishing to develop skills and knowledge at an entry level of hairdressing. Skills and knowledge include: shampooing, selecting and applying treatments, greeting, caring for and farewelling clients, and services and workflow in the salon environment. Includes Unit Standards: 2866, 2869, 9953, 25438.

#### HSS3.102

This course is for students wishing to develop skills and knowledge at an entry level in hairdressing. Elementary skills and knowledge include: blow drying, setting short hair, pin curling, moulding and scaling, and dressing long hair. Includes Unit Standards: 2870, 2871, 25076, 25077 and 25792.

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## Programme Specific Information

### Programme Length

This is a one-year full-time programme of study, or equivalent part-time.

### Class Times

Classes are taught three days per week.

### Assessments

This programme includes competency-based assignments, theory tests and practical assessments.

### Work Experience

This programme has a requirement for students to undertake 80 hours work experience to enhance their formal learning.

### Future Study Options:

New Zealand Certificate in Hairdressing, Emerging Stylist (level 4) or Professional Stylist (level 4) as part of an Industry apprenticeship.

### Career Options:

Hairdresser employed in salons, retail stores, cruise ships, film, TV and fashion.

## PROGRAMME INFORMATION

### HSS3.103

This course is for students wishing to develop skills and knowledge at an entry level of hairdressing. Skills and knowledge include: foundation forms for hair cutting, cutting tools and techniques and cut hair with scissors to a given guideline. Includes Unit Standard: 28837

### HSS3.104

This course is for students wishing to develop skills and knowledge at an entry level of hairdressing. Skills and knowledge include: hairdressing history, influence of historical hair design and techniques on current and emerging hair fashion, personal health and safety, self-styling, sustainability concepts for a salon, safe handling of hairdressing equipment and hand-held tools, safe and professional practice and basic life support. Includes Unit Standards: 2891, 28843, 25439, 25790, 28845 and 6402.
