Gown hire payment

If you haven't already paid for your gown, there are three ways to pay.

- Bank transfer: Use the below details to pay online.

- In person: Visit us at 20 Bell Street, New Plymouth. We are open 8am 5pm, Monday Friday.

Gown and guest ticket collection

Gowns and guest tickets can be collected from TSB Stadium the day before Graduation or on the morning of the ceremony. Please bring your own bag for your gown.

Time: 1pm – 6pm, Wednesday 14 February 9am – 11am, Thursday 15 February

If you are unable to collect your gown at these times, please arrange for a family member or friend to do so on your behalf.

Dress standard for graduating students

Everyone attending the graduation ceremony is required to dress in a formal manner and appropriate attire should be worn. You are welcome to wear cultural dress or other cultural decoration, e.g. korowai or lei. These are worn over your black gown and under your hood.

The following items are not appropriate to wear on the day: jeans, singlets, extremely high heels, jandals, work boots, miniskirts or mini dresses. Please be mindful that the graduation gowns can be quite warm so you will need to wear appropriate but cool attire.

All gowns must be returned to the gown collection area in good condition by 7pm. A \$20 bond refund will be given.

Street parade

Meet at Huatoki Plaza by 12:15pm. The parade will travel along Ariki Street, Egmont Street, Devon Street West, Currie Street and return to Ariki Street. You're welcome to bring your national flag to add to the celebration. The parade will be led by a local highland pipe band.



Parking

Free parking is available at TSB Stadium but please arrive early as it will be busy. Wardens will be on site to assist with parking and directing traffic.

Buses to street parade

There will be a free bus service you can use to get from the TSB Stadium to the street parade and back. Buses depart for the street parade at 11am and return at 1pm to TSB Stadium. There is no need to book.

Graduand sign in

It is compulsory that all graduands sign in for the graduation ceremony at TSB Stadium between 1:30pm and 2:15pm.

Sign in closes at 2:15pm. Please ensure you are on time as latecomers may not be able to take part in the ceremony or cross the stage.

The sign in area is for graduating students only. You will need to ensure that arrangements are made for your children, family members and guests if they are considering arriving early.

Once you have signed in you will not be permitted to leave the area. You will be briefed on graduation proceedings.

Whānau and guests

Whānau and friends are warmly invited to attend your graduation ceremony and the tickets for your guests will be given to you when you collect your gown.

Doors open at the TSB Stadium at 2:30pm. All guests must be seated by 3pm at the latest.



Accessibility

Accessible seating is available for guests. Please advise us as early as possible if you or your guests have any special requirements. For example, using a wheelchair, sight or hearing impaired or have any other medical condition that requires special arrangements.

The ceremony

During the ceremony

The ceremony will begin with a haka pōwhiri and a karakia (blessing).

When it is your turn to go on stage:

- Staff will ask your row to stand and you will be led to the ramp to the left of the stage
- A final name check will be done to make sure you are in order before going on to the stage.

You need to have your hands free to receive your award, so leave handbags, cellphones etc. with your guests.

We ask that after you have accepted your award that you proceed down the stairs and return back to your allocated seat. You'll be seated there until the ceremony is over.

After the ceremony

Light refreshments will be served for you and your whānau/guests after the ceremony. Additional individual and group photos can be taken at this time. Gowns must be returned to the gown collection area by 7pm.

If you are not attending the ceremony, your certificate will be available to collect from the main reception at WITT, 20 Bell Street, You will need to show photo ID for collection.

Photographs

There will be photographers at all parts of the graduation ceremony and all photographs will be available free of charge to download from the <u>WITT website</u> from 5pm Wednesday 21 February.

Refreshment

Graduating students should bring their own water bottles to the street parade. Water bottles will be handed out to whānau and friends as they enter the stadium for the graduation ceremony.

Students will also have access to cups that can be refilled at dispensaries inside the stadium before and after the ceremony.
